The Look in their Eyes is Real: Message from Dr. Jones



We are thrilled to announce that nine of our students have graduated from top colleges with impressive degrees. My staff and I attended many of their graduations, with Denise traveling to New York University, Baldwin Wallace University, Penn State University, and Allegheny College. The most telling sign of their accomplishment was the look in their eyes as they received their degrees, a truly precious sight.

Over the past four years, COVID-19 dulled the world and dimmed the sparkle in their eyes. These students, who left for college bright-eyed and full of hope, faced unimaginable challenges. The pandemic sent them home, stripped them of their freedom, and left several homeless. One student has even shared with us that they had no home to return to after leaving for college due to their family moving to California.

YES stepped in to support our students in every way possible. We turned our office into a classroom, provided internet access, and used Instacart to deliver food to their families. We paid biweekly stipends to help students cover their basic needs and raised funds to cover delinquent tuition. Once COVID restrictions were lifted, we visited colleges and advocated for our students. We found creative solutions to meet internship and externship requirements, including local and virtual internships. The dedication from universities to see these students graduate matched our own. Despite the bureaucracy and financial hurdles, our collaborative efforts ensured their success.

Lastly, I encourage you to review the 2024 Spring iteration of the YCLA program. It has been another resounding success. The third iteration of our Youth Civic Leadership Academy wrapped up on May 15th at the Heinz History Center! Our cohort of 20 scholars showcased their incredible dedication and passion after completing a rigorous 17-week program. Their hard work was truly commendable as they presented innovative solutions to a range of pressing issues. The event was a vibrant display of creativity and hard work, with students eagerly presenting their findings. We are incredibly proud of our youth for taking an initiative to make the world around them a better place.



Jaquan Brockman '24, General Studies & Graphic Design - Community College of Allegheny County

"My collegiate experience can be described with many words, but I think that the best word to describe it is atypical. My journey began at Carlow University in 2018 immediately after high school as a political science major my freshman fall semester, a business management major my freshman spring semester, but I decided to switch to a general studies major to get a better understanding of my passions and interests after receiving a second chance due to my horrific academic performance my freshman year. I failed nearly all of my courses because I lacked a sense of purpose during this period of my life. I was genuinely lost, but nonetheless, YES still helped me appeal my status and re-enroll for the fall 2019 semester on academic probation. I was driven to make the most out of this opportunity and began to do what I was supposed to be doing from the start. At that time, I was enrolled in an introductory social work course and immediately fell in love with it. So much so, that I was intending on declaring it as my major for the following semester. However, I had a balance on my account that prohibited me from enrolling and since I was unable to pay it, I ultimately had to withdraw from Carlow at the end of my fall sophomore semester (December 2019). I planned on enrolling into CCAC for the following fall semester, but COVID began to shut the world down mere days before I was scheduled for my placement test the following March. So, instead of attempting to enroll in online courses, I decided to take a break from college and work until COVID began to stabilize and I could enroll in in-person instruction. I picked up photography during COVID, my hiatus from college, and at the height of the Black Lives Matter protests in 2020 following the murders of George Floyd and Breonna Taylor, so I also made it a mission to uplift Black voices and Black beauty with my work. Once I did manage to enroll at CCAC as a general studies major, I was hired as the Media Specialist here at YES just a few months later (October 2021). At this point, I had decided that I wanted to pursue film and ty production since movies are essentially moving photos, so I had a clear purpose and that was reflected in my transcripts. During my first spring semester at CCAC, I enrolled in an introductory graphic design course and immediately fell in love with it. I later decided to add on a graphic design certificate program in addition to my general studies degree that I was already pursuing. I ended up graduating with my associate's in general studies and a graphic design certificate, both of which were with Honors while experiencing homelessness after my home was destroyed by an SUV at the beginning of my summer 2023 semester. I have also been accepted into the Savannah College of Art & Design as well as California College of the Arts for Film and Television Production and to this day. have had eleven art exhibitions and fourteen publications of my portraits. I say all of this to emphasize that at the end of the day, it truly does not matter how you start or even what you thought your plan was because life has a funny way of putting you in front of people and opportunities to excel you in ways that you could not fathom just only five years ago. There's a million things I haven't done, yet I will forever be grateful to YES and I'm eternally glad to say that they were a part of my story." -Jaquan Brockman

2024 YCLA Students Successfully Present their Research at the Culminating Symposium




We are thrilled to announce the successful conclusion of the 3rd iteration of our Youth
