YES faced some of its toughest challenges in 2022. From the lows of burying students who died way too young from gun violence to the highs of embarking on a weekend trip to Washington D.C. with a group of close to 50 young people for a cultural immersion experience. During this year, some of YES' team members transitioned away from the organization, returning to school or moving elsewhere. Yet, this year also brought some of the best and brightest on board. These committed individuals come to YES with a desire to support the mission with all of their energy, enthusiasm, and idealism.

We feel that YES has begun to understand the deeper nature of our program impacts. Young people feel compelled to write their own story. To become advocates and activists rather than victims. For the first time in our organization's existence, we are receiving funding for programs

that will change the nature of what we do and how we do it.



We also feel that YES has met the moment. The surge in gun violence, especially among young people, in our community and the continued impact of the COVID-19 pandemic have taken tolls on all of us. YES has learned that it has a choice. YES received investment funding from the Pittsburgh Foundation, PCCD, and the YWCA

to further grow our organizational and programmatic efforts. The Pittsburgh Foundation offered generous operating and programming support for our truancy efforts. The YWCA provided funding to continue our work to mitigate the compounding impact that community violence and the invisible labor of womanhood have on females of color through our Female Empowerment and Wellness Initiative (FeWi). PCCD extended resources to support our teen and parent councils' community gun violence efforts which will largely be youth-led and youth-centered.
